Please note the tax levy limit for the year 2024-2025 from the Office of the State Comptroller is \$4,648,024 for the Riverhead Free Library. The proposed levy is \$4,923,548 for the 2024-2025 year for the Riverhead Free Library. The proposed levy is over the tax cap levy limit by \$275,524. The levy limit is composed of the tax base growth factor of 1.0104 and the allowable levy growth factor of 1.0200 for a total allowable levy increase of \$149,969 to remain under the tax cap.

Riverhead Free Library has developed and implemented a thoughtful five-year plan during which we will be undertaking significant necessary capital improvements aimed to substantially improve our library building and grounds. We are asking our community to assist us and engage this challenge by agreeing to contribute financial support for this program. The priority and first of these improvements is targeted toward addressing our dated and inadequate HVAC system which is over 23 years old; the current hardware and system is in disrepair, in need of frequent service, and not energy efficient enough by today's standards. The prospective replacement of the Library's heating and air conditioning system is not a luxury and is in fact very necessary to maintain an appropriate standard for the health and well-being of everyone who enters the building whether staff or community alike. The humidity level in our lower level meeting rooms has been monitored and was found to be too high and as a result we were faced with an issue of the presence of mold which required costly remediation. The present system has been evaluated by a professional team of mechanical engineers and HVAC systems specialists and we have had blueprints fabricated and prepared to execute the project this spring. This is a project requiring prompt attention and we hope that you feel similarly.

Our patrons and community at large have been patiently making their needs known and we have been enthusiastically listening. The present design of the library is not consistent with an efficient and functional gathering place for meetings and general library use. Listening intently, you have made us aware of the need for a new upgraded sound system for our Grand Room which is the place where all of our fantastic musical programs, films and lectures come to life. Our current sound system is barely operational and far from a system this room and those who participate really deserve. Projects to enhance not only the library facility but also the infra-structure are invaluable to the effort of providing state of the art programming our community deserves.

We also plan to implement updates to our Youth and Family Services department including a Digital Play Table. The 32" play touch table provides an educational, fun, interactive experience for children of all ages, starting at age 3. Users choose from a portfolio of up to 21 multi-touch games and the table allows up to four players simultaneously. The table provides a unique experience that is collaborative and social for both children and teens.

We have judiciously saved and put aside monies dedicated with these types of impending needs in mind, we are thus well-positioned to address most of the necessary capital improvement plan; additionally, RFL has been approved for a grant to assist with the HVAC system, but we do require additional funding to complete these necessary endeavors. We are requesting that the community contribute to these well-thought-out projects by supporting our proposed budget. If approved, the average home in the Riverhead Central School District assessed at \$44,802 will be pay a total of \$291.20 in taxes for the year for the Riverhead Free Library. This is an increase of \$25.03 over last year's cost. We sincerely believe this increase is modest when compared to the return on investment.

Join us on Wednesday, March 13 at 6 pm for the budget informational meeting and to meet and greet the trustee candidates. Please be sure to cast your very important vote on April 9th.

The 2024-2025 budget levy is \$4,923,548. \$4,785,548 is for the operating budget for fiscal year July 1, 2024 - June 30, 2025. \$138,000 is for our capital improvement program.

Your Board of Trustees believes that the budget proposal is worthy of your approval and a win for both the library and even more importantly for you, our community.

HOW PROPERTY TAXES ARE CALCULATED

- 1) The Riverhead Free Library Proposed Tax Levy for the 2024-2025 Fiscal Year is \$4,923,548
- 2) The Riverhead School District 2023-2024 Assessed Valuation is \$757,078,291
- 3) The tax rate is determined by dividing the Tax Levy by the total Taxable Assessed value of all property in the jurisdiction
- 4) Because tax rates are generally expressed as "per \$1,000 of taxable assessed value," the product is multiplied by 1,000
- 5) \$4,923,548/\$757,078,291 = 0.00650335382 x 1,000 = \$6.50. The tax rate for the 2024-2025 Fiscal Year is \$6.50 per \$1,000 of taxable assessed value
- 6) Per the Town of Riverhead Tax Assessor's Office, the average value for a home in the Riverhead School District is \$44,802
- 7) Therefore, a home with an assessed value of \$44,802 would pay \$291.20 in taxes towards the Riverhead Free Library's 2024-2025 Fiscal Year Budget. \$44,802/1000 = \$44.80 X \$6.50= \$291.20
